“Summer Sounds in the Park”

Come bring a picnic and chairs and sit back and listen to the Guilderland Town Band directed by Kathleen Richards Ehlinger.

The free concert will be performed Thursday, July 18, at 7:30 PM in the Guilderland Performing Arts Center, in Tawasentha Park, Guilderland. The program will include a variation on Dvorak’s Symphony No. 9 in E minor (“From the New World”) by David Shaffer. You’ll here a bit of Gershwin, Broadway (sung by our own David Canavan), Sousa and a featured trombone section playing Trombone Blues. Our lead trumpet player will be another feature performing the Carnival of Venice by H.L. Clarke. The band will conclude with an exciting piece called American Salute by Morton Gould and America the Beautiful by Samuel Augustus Ward.

The band will be under the direction of Kathleen Richards Ehlinger. Guilderland Town Band performs three concerts each summer under the auspices of the Town of Guilderland Parks and Recreation Program. The concert is free and open to the public. The Guilderland Performing Arts Center is located in Carl Walters Tawasentha Park on Route 146 ¼ mile south of Route 20 in Guilderland. Parking is free and refreshments are available at the concession stand. The public is encouraged to bring a blanket or lawn chair. There is no rain date planned for this concert.
