Mark was a violinist, orchestra conductor and Department Chairman of Music in the South Colonie Schools. He was a friend to many of us in the band. Mark is survived by his wife Jolene Cornell and two daughters, Janessa and Kelsey.

## **Col. Arnald D. Gabriel**

Guilderland Town Band is delighted to welcome Col. Arnald D. Gabriel as guest conductor for our second concert of our anniversary season July 22. Col. Gabriel was the Commander/Conductor of the internationally renowned U.S. Air Force Band, Symphony Orchestra, and Singing Sergeants in Washington D.C. from 1964 to 1985. Following his retirement from the Air Force in 1985 he served on the faculty of George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia until 1995, during which time he conducted the GMU Symphony Orchestra.

One of the worlds's most widely traveled musicians, Col. Gabriel has conducted ensembles in all 50 of the United States and in 48 countries around the world. He continues to appear as clinician at major, state, regional and university music festivals and guest conducts outstanding school, college, municipal and military bands and orchestras around the world. He is currently the Conductor and Music Director of the McLean Orchestra in Virginia.

We are sure our audience will enjoy the exciting program Col. Gabriel has chosen for his program. We hope you will all plan to attend this 'first' for Guilderland Town Band and welcome him to the GPAC stage. Be sure to tell your friends and neighbors to come too.
